

Kids Life Kamp General Information for Parents, Campers, & Sponsors

How to Write your Child:

Please make sure that the child's name and the church's name that they are attending camp with are written on the envelope. If they are with a First Baptist Church please also include the city's name (I.E. Natalie Bowman, First Baptist Church, Conroe).

Dress Code:

1. Modesty is the standard for everything worn at camp.
2. Shorts are permitted for all activities. They must be longer than mid-thigh and may not have messages written on the seat. Shorts with laced sides are not permitted.
3. Clothing must not be worn in a manner that allows undergarments to be visible.
4. Shirts should not be low-cut, see-through, or too short to cover the mid-drift during normal physical activities. No strapless or spaghetti straps. Sleeveless shirts must not reveal undergarments or the flesh that undergarments are intended to cover.
5. The camp T-shirt should not be cut or altered in any way while at camp.
6. T-shirts, caps, etc., that advertise alcohol or tobacco, or are of a suggestive nature will not be worn.
7. Girls' swimwear must be a modest one-piece suit, otherwise else a heavy T-shirt must be worn to cover it.
8. Boys' swimwear must be trunk-type.
9. The lifeguard may eject anyone wearing swimwear considered in poor taste.
10. All Campers/Sponsors must wear shirts, shoes and T-shirts/cover-ups going to and from the pool. A towel is not sufficient.
11. For safety reasons, shoes or sandals must be worn at all times during camp and closed-toed shoes must be worn at all activities.

Bringing Extra Money:

We encourage you to use this program for the prevention of any money loss. Take 4 envelopes and place your child's name on each one. Next, label one for each day of camp. Place whatever amount of money you wish your child to have for each day respectively. You may want to use a 5th envelope for craft money (\$2-\$4) and/or missionary offering. These envelopes will be bundled for each child separately, held by a sponsor, and handed out to each child daily.

What To Bring:

Bible
Camp Clothes & Closed-toed shoes
Swim Suit
Towels/Wash Cloths
Sleeping Bag or Linens & Pillow
Pen/Pencil
Money for crafts/snacks/offering
Soap, Shampoo, Deodorant, Toothpaste

What Not To Bring:

Cell Phones/Pagers (Sponsors exception)
Fireworks
Balloons
Tobacco of any kind
Shaving Cream
Radios/Stereos/CD Players
Video Games
Electronic Device

In Case Of An Emergency:

If you need to get a hold of a camper or sponsor you will need to call the Carolina Creek office, the phone number is 936-594-4446. Remember please call only if there is an emergency!!! Emergency messages that need to be delivered to a camper will be given to their sponsor and the sponsor will be responsible for getting the message to your child. Only emergency messages will be delivered.

Do not use this phone number to call your child to see how the week is going. Campers are not allowed to use this phone. Also, any call to your child can trigger a rash of homesickness that can destroy the week for your child and some of those around them.

Medication:

State Law requires that ALL medication be kept at the Clinic/First Aid Station. This means all Rx and OTC medications for adults and children. There is a supply of common OTC medications in the Clinic/First Aid Station, and it is available 24 hours a day.

1. All medication must be in its properly labeled bottle.
2. All Rx medication must be in the properly labeled bottle that came from the pharmacy. It must have the camper's name, the name of the medication with time and dosing instructions on the label.
3. Do not send medication for siblings in the same Rx bottle unless both names are on the pharmacy typed label.
4. If physician's samples are sent, they must be accompanied by the physician's written instructions, with the camper's name and dosing instructions.
5. Do not send any medication in daily pillboxes, unmarked bottles, envelopes, baggies, etc.
6. If medication is not sent in the properly label bottle, it will not be given.

Returning Home:

Camp activities will go through 10:00 am on Wednesday for Camp 1 and 10:00 am on Saturday for Camp 2. They will be served breakfast on the morning of the last day but lunch will not be provided. Dorms will be checked and must be cleaned before anyone can leave camp.

What TO Bring

- A Fantastic Attitude
- Swim Suit (Girls – One Piece; Guys – Swim Shorts, No Speedos)
- Water shoes (**closed-toed shoes that can be worn in the water - required for lake activities**)
- A Pair of sturdy athletic shoes**
- Shorts for 3 days + extra
- T-Shirts for 3 days + extra
- Socks for 3 days + extra
- Sleepwear
- 1 Beach Towel
- 1 Bath Towel
- 1 Wash Cloth
- A Pair of Jeans
- A light/water-resistant Sweat Shirt/Jacket
- Sleeping bag or twin-size sheets, blanket, and pillow
- Toiletries (SOAP, Toothpaste & Brush, Shampoo, DEODORANT)
- Sunscreen
- 1 Flashlight
- 1 Bible
- 1 Notebook and Pen
- Insect Repellent
- Camera (Optional)

**Campers and sponsors must wear shoes at all activities so please bring a pair of comfortable shoes and another pair of shoes that may be worn in the water. (Shoes are not required inside of the pool area, but must be worn to and from the pool.)

What NOT TO Bring

- iPod's, Mp3 Players, Electronic/Video Games, Laptops, Cell Phones
- Candy, Gum, Food of any kind (We will sell sweets and snacks at designated times)
- No Food or Drinks allowed in Cabins
- Knives
- Guns
- Fireworks
- Grumbling, griping or sour attitudes
- Anything else that could get you in trouble!
